

SRWC TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CITIZENS VOLUNTEER MONITORING WORKSHOP

On Friday evening and Saturday, Oct.15 and 16, respectively, a workshop will be held at the Jennings Environmental Education Center. This workshop is the third in a series of seven workshops for volunteer monitors throughout the state which is being held by the DEP's Citizen's Volunteer Monitoring Program in collaboration with the Canaan Valley Institute. The workshop to be conducted at Jennings will include "handson" field demonstrations and interaction with participants in the SRWC including Dr. Dean DeNicola, Biologist, (Slippery Rock University), Dr. Fred Brenner, Biologist, (Grove City College), Jo Ann Albert and Will Taylor, Environmental Education Specialists, (Jennings Environmental Education Center), Mark Killar (Western PA Coalition for Abandoned Mine Reclamation), and Tim Danehy, Environmental Scientist, and Margaret Dunn, Geologist, (Stream Restoration Inc.). Saturday's activities (in the field) will include "how to's" of monitoring the chemical, biological, and physical characteristics of streams and discharges as well as habitat assessment.
