The purpose of the meeting is to discuss and accept comments on proposed TMDLs, established in accordance with the requirements of the 1996 Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act. This is a wonderful opportunity to come out and learn about this process. The regular SRWC meeting will take place following this public meeting.


