Get "Back to Basics" at the AMD Conference

The 8th Annual Pennsylvania Statewide Conference on Abandoned Mine Reclamation will be held August 24 to 26 at the Atherton Hotel in State College. The theme of this year's AMD and AMR Conference is "Back to Basics." This will be a time for presenting basic materials to watershed groups on subjects important to them. Workshops related to outreach, policy, science, and watershed planning will be offered to attendees.

The program will feature presentations on passive mine drainage treatment systems, evaluating water monitoring results, identification of funding sources for projects, AMD chemistry, an update on SMCRA Title 4 Reauthorization, and much more! Watershed groups, public agencies, consultants, local and state officials will all be in attendance to network and share their craft.

This event includes participation by watershed groups, citizens, businesses, local, state, and federal government reps, students and educators. Join us as we network with those involved with the Allegheny, Ohio, and Monongahela Rivers and celebrate the fact that the PA Department of Conservation & Natural Resources has named our Three Rivers the "Rivers of the Year!"
