2010 Port of Pittsburgh Ohio River Watershed Celebration is September 15!!

Mark your calendars and make your plans to attend the Port of Pittsburgh Ohio River Watershed Celebration on <u>Wednesday, September 15</u>! This year's theme is "Touch the Water" and will feature a cruise on the Allegheny River and through the Highland Park Lock and Dam. Once again, two separate cruises will take place on the same day. The largest vessel in the Gateway Clipper's Fleet, the *Majestic*, will host the "Networker Cruise" for environmental professionals, watershed groups, energy conservationists, government personnel, business and industry leaders, educators, and interested citizens. Watershed and Energy Efficiency presentations will be provided throughout the cruise. As we sail, many points of interest, current and historical, will be highlighted. *Over 60* watershed and energy related displays will be on the Majestic! All participants will have the opportunity to meet and talk directly with organization representatives. For the younger crowd, students in grades K-12, the "Imagination Cruise" will take place aboard the Empress. This cruise is a hands-on exploration of the Allegheny River Watershed for school age students, their parents and teachers. Students will receive a wealth of free materials, information, and fuel for their imagination.

Boarding for each of the boats will begin at 12:30 PM and we will set sail at 1 PM sharp from the Station Square dock in Pittsburgh. ASMR Conference a Success in Pittsburgh!

As the world-record holder for cities with the most bridges with piers and stands contained entirely within city limits, it was fitting that Pittsburgh hosted the 2010 American Society of Mining & Reclamation Conference with a theme to "Bridge Reclamation, Science, and the Community." The Conference was held June 6-10 at the Radisson in Greentree, Pittsburgh, with over 250 attendees! Academia, industry and environmental professionals, non-profit representatives from across the nation convened to share technologies, success stories, and innovative solutions. Among the attendees were the SRWC's Margaret Dunn, Tim Danehy, Wil Taylor, Cliff Denholm, Shaun Busler, Tom Grote, Wil Taylor, Valentin & Galena Kefeli, Bryan Page, Laurie Popeck, Joshua McGinnis, and Buck Neely.

The PA Abandoned Mine Reclamation (AMR) Conference's coveted "Mayfly Award" was presented during a special riverboat cruise. The purpose of this award is to recognize individuals who have dedicated a lifetime of knowledge and expertise to the reclamation of abandoned mines in Pennsylvania. This year's recipient was Deputy Secretary for the PA Dept. of Environmental Protection's (DEP) Office of Mineral Resources Management, Scott Roberts, a man recognized and admired by his peers. "Early on he recognized the value of working with watershed groups to help reclaim abandoned mines and treat mine water," said former PA DEP secretary Dave Hess. "Scott helped to oversee programs that from 1995 to 2003 reclaimed over 33,000 acres of abandoned mined lands, more than at any other time in

> the state's history." In his executive management position, Scott oversees 555 employees.
