Schoolhouse Restoration

Turns out there is more to restore in the Slippery Rock Creek Watershed than just land and streams impacted by abandoned mine drainage! This particular location was impacted by time and the 2nd Law of Thermodynamics (the law of increasing entropy — as time goes by, everything decays, breaks down, etc.) We're talking about the Foltz Schoolhouse, located in Slippery Rock and under the care of Jennings Environmental Education Center. This one room, township school was built in 1880, on the site of a former log school. After 83 years of classes, the school closed in 1963. Foltz school was one of the last five public, one room schools to close in Pennsylvania. Many residents can remember when the building was in ruins, to the point

where it didn't even have a roof. Well, bring on the Jennings "Schoolhouse Crew"! These hard workers have accomplished much successful restoration over the past couple of years, showing admirable dedication to the park and to this project. In fact, their hard work was recently recognized with an award from the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (PA DCNR) for "outstanding dedication and performance" with the restoration work. Staff at Jennings are anxious to show off the results soon. From running electric to drywalling, from painting, painting, and more painting to collaborating with partners and leveraging the time, talents, and resources of the community and beyond, the "Schoolhouse Crew" has spent countless hours to bring this historical treasure back to life. We thank them for their hard work and look forward to seeing everything real soon!

Lake Arthur Regatta August 5-7

Mark your calendars for the Moraine State Park Regatta and plan for some summertime fun! A full weekend of free family fun at the shores of beautiful Lake Arthur will have something to offer everyone. The 2021 event saw a record 28,000 attendees! This year's eco-recreational event is sure to please the crowds once again, as many exciting activities are planned. Some of the fun will include a car cruise, corn hole tournament, classes and demonstrations of yoga, tai chi, martial arts, pilates, etc., guided nature hikes, live music, a vendor marketplace featuring food trucks galore, work from local crafts and artisans, showcases from area businesses and service providers, an amazing fireworks display, children's activities, lake tours and work-

shops hosted by expert instructors and local outfitters, water activities such as kayaking, canoeing, rowing, stand-up paddle-boarding, sailing, fishing, etc.

This year will mark the first time the Annual Pittsburgh Paddlesport Championships will be held at Lake Arthur, allowing spectators the fun opportunity to cheer on competitors in events such as kayaking and paddle-boarding. In keeping with tradition, a butterfly release will take place on Sunday, August 7. The sky will fill with color and movement during a mass release of close to 500 beautiful monarch butterflies, a creature the park works hard to help via milkweed and habitat protection and propagation.






